Only personnel requested by the AC are allowed to work in the AC Command Facility.<br>2. All AC personnel will check in with the resources unit and provide contact information.<br><br><b>Procedures:</b><br>1. Guidance on AC policy and procedures is contained in the ICS implementation Plan, the Incident Management Handbook, the AREA SOP and this management plan. Some additional conceptual guidance is contained in firefighting resources, but is limited.<br>2. All personnel assigned to the AC shall use the AC Job Aid and Incident Management Handbook (IMH) for carrying out their responsibilities.<br><br><b>Decisions:</b><br>1. Due to the critical nature of some issues, all decisions for resource allocation or operational changes should be briefed to the AC for approval.<br>2. The Documentation Unit Leader shall maintain a critical decision log for significant decisions. All sections shall ensure that all material is provided to the Documentation Unit.<br>3. AC will approve the release of all Critical Resources. |  |  |
